ABOUT THE 2007 CONCLAVE

The Leadership Institute will include the biennial meeting of the Assembly of Delegates, the governing body of Kappa Omicron Nu, and an intensive leadership development program. The theme of the 2007 Institute, “Leading with Excellence,” will be implemented through interactive sessions on the application of Reflective Human Action to organizational and personal settings. Two sessions will feature student research presentations. During the Assembly of Delegates Meeting, voting delegates will elect Student Board Members, consider business of Kappa Omicron Nu, and participate in a forum to determine priorities for the “ends” (to achieve the mission) of Kappa Omicron Nu.

The Reflective Human Action Leadership Development Model will guide the leadership development sessions: strengthening self-awareness, developing relationships and teamwork, understanding alliances and political realities, and understanding the elements of a promising future. The Leadership Institute will conclude with development of a personal action plan for enhancing leadership. The Institute will provide twelve hours of leadership development by professional leaders in the Human Sciences.

Academic programs are invited to register undergraduate and graduate students in addition to the Kappa Omicron Nu delegates. National Kappa Omicron Nu will pay the registration fee for the official chapter delegate; chapters usually fund the other expenses for the delegate. Any number of chapter members may register.
